LONDON WORK EXPERIENCE 2018/19

This project "Studying without borders V" enabled the work experience of 38 students of the Business School, Secondary Special School for Librarians and Further Education College Brno to Great Britain for two weeks (10 working days).




The winter term of this project was attended by 19 students: David Fojtík (3.A), Nikola Svobodová (3.A), Eva Gottwaldová (3.A), Luisa Freimuthová (3.A), Patrik Cihlář (3.A), Jasmína Chenová (3.B), Eliška Rybáková (3.C), Julie Procházková (3.D), Lenka Ursacherová (3.D), Lukáš Tölg (3.K), Adéla Málková (3.K), Tereza Doležalová (3.AV), Zuzana Martinková (3.AV), Natálie Vlasáková (3.BV), Magda Bínková (3.P), Eliška Musilová (3.P), Valentina Mešková (3.Q), Jana Kalhousová (3.VK), Markéta Frömelová (3.VK)

We received the grant from the European Union project Erasmus+ and 19 students + 2 teachers could travel to London in December. There is another group that will go in April. We are the ninth group that was given this chance to live and work in the United Kingdom for two weeks. Everything was financed by the European Union. All we needed was pocket money.

During the time we worked in various London companies: Redmond Community Centre, BSN Social Care (Nexus Fostering), Active Care, Kilburn Library, CCLS English School, Maple Estates, Ultra Estates SJW, Hilliers Vision, etc.

We became part of a team and were supervised at all times by at least one mentor. We participated in everyday procedures and developed new specialised skills in the field of our study. The managers prepared daily work tasks and monitored our progress together with our accompanying teachers. The managers evaluated our achievements at the end of the working experience.

Most of us worked in different companies. Those of us who are students of business school worked with business correspondence and with databases of clients, prepared presentations, dealt with internet enquiries, answered phones, took messages, served and advised customers



and supported senior staff. We did some market research, assisted various computerized activities such processing, data input, emailing. We worked with internal IT system, PCs, scanners printers, other office equipment. We also had some general duties such as filling, faxing and photocopying. We assisted and communicated with customers on daily basis and thus improved their communication skills.

The typical tasks of students of information services and librarianship were answering reference inquiries, lending documents to the user via automatic library systems, creating catalogue records of documents and books, modifying records in the database of books, looking up relevant records and communication with clients.

Students of social services dealt with documents, clients and prepared their case history. Other tasks were preparing an analysis on the specifics of the particular minority according to the type of the organization, offer of services and intervention.

After working hours we had free time which we spent together or went sightseeing. We lived in host families which provided us with food and place to stay. Every once in a while we all met in the ADC College, which is the partner of our school in Erasmus+. If we had any problem we could consult it with our teachers or an ADC College employee.

It was great experience for all of us because we learned new skills and improved our English. At the end of the two weeks work placement project a ceremony was held at ADC College to celebrate our achievements – we received the certificates of completing our work placement. We also received references from our employers and Europass Mobility. Some of us were offered a part-time job for summer.

Our programme

On the first day when we came to London (Sunday) we were given Oyster and SIM cards and met our host families with whom we spend the evening to get to know them. On Monday we all met in ADC College and they told us details about travelling in London. After the meeting we had to find our way to our companies and take a selfie which we had to show in ADC College. Then we started working.

At the weekend we all went sightseeing. We visited e. g. Parliament, London Eye, Madame Tussaud's. From Monday to Friday we were working. In the end we met at the ADC College where each of us received Europass Mobility. In the evening our group visited Sky Garden with beautiful views of the city. On Saturday we said goodbye to our host families and travelled back to Brno.



We managed work in companies without problems and our employers appraised our communication skills, professional skills and work attitude. We improved our skills in contact with customers, administrative work and use of information technologies. We also learned to present their work to our colleagues or customers in a suitable way, which contributed to the development of our soft-skills. We broadened our professional English terminology. All these aspects will enable us to gain competitive advantage at the labour market. New experience from London companies will be used during our further education and practice.

Work experience abroad is nothing to worry about. If you doubt it read about our experience in this brochure. It can be your turn next year!

Magda Bínková, 3.P – Further Education College, Law and Economics – Legal Studies

Work

I spent my internship in the company Capital Business Links, which is an accounting company providing bookkeeping and accounting for mostly Polish companies in UK (but also for Polish companies in Poland and Czech or British companies in UK). The company has many kinds of clients - limited companies, self-employed persons, partnerships and individuals. Capital Business Links provides services for more than 3 000 companies (including huge companies with millions turnover, but also start-ups).

They have about 50 employees and interns. I was not the only intern in the company. They have open office for all interns - during my internship I met 7 other interns - from Portugal, Greece, Latvia and Poland. There were also 3 students from a school in London. Each intern had his/her own mentor - who was giving them the tasks and help when needed.

My mentor was Miss Marta Klosinska, she is from Poland and she is responsible for administration. Therefore my tasks mainly included work concerning administration work. At the beginning of my internship I was given only basic tasks and basic instructions. I started with shredding, copying and scanning of documents.



Every accountant in the company has his/her own office with folders of companies he/she is responsible for. My second task was to put those folders in the alphabetical order. Then my colleagues showed me how the database of clients works. I was given the post for all company - my task was to find the company in the database, write the name of accountant responsible for particular company, find out whether the scan of the document from post is needed (if it was needed, I used copier to do so). After this process I went to the particular offices and put the documents to the folders according to the name of companies. This was my everyday task.

Another of my tasks was also connected with the client database. I was given an Excel document with names of some of the clients and my task was to find out particular information about those companies. During my internship I made a few of those Excel documents with different information.

The last task I was given was connected again with client database. From accountants I was given packages with completed documents for clients. My task was to find out their addresses, language in which they want to be contacted and which way of delivering they prefer. Then I put all this information into the Excel document.

These were my main tasks during my internship. Thanks to the supportive, friendly and helpful colleagues I was able to do all this tasks without any problem. The environment of the company in general was very friendly and there was positive atmosphere all around. Also I was surprised by positive attitude of all employees in the company.

The only disadvantage connected with this company for me was commuting. The company is located in Ealing, West London and I had to go there by bus (5 minutes), underground (10 minutes) and most of my way I went by double decker (sometimes 1 hour, sometimes 1,5 hour) and because of terrible London traffic, sometimes I spent more than 2 hours by commuting to/from work. My working hours were from 9 a.m. to 17 p.m. - sometimes I had a

problem to get to the work on time, because of the traffic. But my colleagues are used to it, so they always accepted it without any problems.

Accommodation

I shared the room with my classmate Eliška Musilová. We lived in North Harrow at Janice Newton. She is a retiree and she spent a lot of time by looking after her grandchildren, as she has really big family. She made us feel really welcomed and introduced us to all of her grandchildren. The house was clean and dinners tasty. Janice was very nice and it was not problem to agree with her on moving the dinner on late hours or on coming home later - we just have to send her SMS.

We shared the room with 2 beds, 2 cabinets, fridge, internet, mirror and beautiful paints. The bus stop was only a



few meters from our house. Also underground was not so far from our house and the way to the city centre took only about 30 minutes which was great.

With Eliška we were enjoying the traveling around the city, trying exotic but also traditional British food and drinks, and shopping. The atmosphere in the restaurants was great every

time. We also enjoyed the weekend program with our group. For me, it was the first time seeing those amazing famous historical buildings.

All in all I really enjoyed this London experience and I am very grateful for this opportunity. I would definitely recommend this Erasmus + programme to all students.


Patrik Cihlář, 3.A - Business Academy

Work

The first day in London I was afraid about finding the way to my work because I had never been there. Finally everything was fine and funny too. I was working in TELC UK which is an English school which offers English courses for everyone. My main tasks were scheduling and posting photos for company's social media then filling invoices and preparing students' evaluation in MS Excel.

Every employee in this company was very helpful and especially kind. My supervisor was Concetta Palmieri, she is from Italy so it was easier for me to understand her because she is not a native speaker either. The last day she sent me to take care of some letters to send from post office.

Work

I spent my work experience in the company Redmond Community Centre. It is located in Woodberry Down on Kayani Avenue. The centre is host to local community groups, events and activities for everyone to enjoy. The centre was completed and opened by the Mayor of

Hackney in February 2012. It is managed by Manor House Development Trust which was formed in 2007. Manor House Development Trust is a charitable social enterprise. They deliver and help other organisations to deliver community services which are value for money and create lasting benefits. This approach allows the community to lead and determine its own future.

The first day I was really afraid of finding my new job address, because it was about one hour far from house of our host family. First I had to travel by fast train to London Euston. From there, I had to by the underground (Victoria line) and change for Picadilly line which goes to Manor House station and is not so far from my work. My supervisor was Emmanuel Wachukwu, he was really nice to me in every situation. about 10 colleagues, Hennaz was my favourite one, she was a really nice person, and I'm in contact with her till now. Every morning I prepared coffee or tea for everybody, it was like a ritual for us and



then we talked to each other about yesterday. It was a really nice start of the day. My main task was work on reception, calling clients and talking to them.

Accommodation

I was staying with my classmate and my best friend Zuzka at Azra's. She was so nice to us, as if we were her own daughters. If we wanted to stay a

little bit longer in the centre of London, we just had to write to her in What's up application that we would be late and she left our dinner for us. She was Indian, so she cooked to us usually something healthy with rice or pasta. Although it was a little bit spicy, it was really tasty for me and Zuzka, because we love it. Our room was really nice and girlish. Next two weeks she was really talkative and helpful. She helped us with everything we wanted and she always asked us when we came from work, how our day at work and London was. That was really cool of her. We had no problem at all, the only thing which was really bad, is that it was

really cold in our room at night, but everybody had the same experience as us with this, so I think it's normal for them.

Free time



As I said before, I was really lucky that my best friend Zuzka was with me all the time. So usually after work we went to the centre of London. One day it was Oxford Street, other days it was Piccadilly Circus and other famous places. At the weekend we had program together with our teachers and other students from our group. On Saturday we visited the interior of the Parliament, which was a really nice experience, as the whole throne of the Queen was made from gold and I always wanted to see it. Then we went to Trafalgar

Square, which is famous for its four big lions, and the National Gallery with van Gogh's Sunflowers. Then we went to Piccadilly Circus, famous for big televisions with advertisements, which is similar to Times Square in NY. I want to say that in Piccadilly there

really were nice Christmas decorations - lights in shapes of angels. Next day, on Saturday we were in the Tower and we saw famous Crown jewels. Then we went across the Tower Bridge and I bought there a really nice tea mug. I use it every day now. Work

I worked in the company CCLS English School. It's a language school providing regular English courses and also e-learning courses mostly for foreigners in London, who would like to stay there, but can't speak English.

I worked in my own office (it was a small classroom) on my own and I carried out tasks I got from my supervisor or from my colleague. My main tasks were posting on social media and scheduling them, working with client databases, sending promo messages and finding potential students.

I did these as a daily routine and once I had them done, I helped with laminating posters, or my supervisors send me to deposit money to the post office.



My working hours were from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and I had the opportunity not to have the lunch break and to go home at 2 p.m. My working hours were the shortest ones, most of my friend worked to 5 p.m. or to 6 p.m.



Commuting to the workplace took about 20 minutes, which I was really happy about.

Overall I loved this company, the atmosphere was nice, colleagues were always very helpful and friendly and I found most of the tasks being very interesting, or even handy for my project, I'm working on here in Brno.

Free time

I had some free time for myself after I finished my work so I went home and chilled a bit. I appreciated the fact that I could do pretty much anything I wanted.

I worked a bit on my project that I've mentioned in the first paragraph and then I went to the centre to meet with my friends and to go sightseeing together.

We visited places such as St. Paul's Cathedral, we were in Stonebridge Park, and we also visited places like Soho, Millennium Bridge, Camden Town, China Town, Carnaby Street or famous Platform 9 3/4 from Harry Potter movies.

At the weekend our whole group spent some time together, with our teachers we saw Westminster Abbey, we passed by Big Ben when we went to visit the Houses of Parliament, we were on Trafalgar Square, China Town, and we were in the Madame Tussaud's Museum.

Another day we went to the National Gallery, we were in front of the Buckingham Palace to see the changing of the guards and we also had a great time in St. James Park., we had a chance to see the crown jewellers in the Tower of London and the whole Tower itself. After that, we saw the Tower Bridge and we took a ride in the London Eye.

Next Thursday we went to Sky Garden, where you can see the whole London from the bird's perspective.

Accommodation

I stayed with my two friends in one very friendly family with Arabic origins. It was mother with three adult sons, but the youngest one still lived with her, so we sometimes could see him at home. We've never heard about their father, there were some family photos in the kitchen including him, but the pictures were very old.

We had two rooms and we could use bathroom when we wanted to, but they preferred us to take showers in the evening. We could also go out in the garden, so we spent some time there and when I was home alone. because everyone else was



still working, I was usually in the living room.

For breakfast we usually had bread with marmalade or with chocolate spread, we had money to buy lunch on our own, but the dinner was prepared by our "substitute mum". She cooked meals such as fried chicken with chips, or omelettes with potatoes. We also had a benefit of a flexible dinner time, because she left the food for us in some heat keeping pot, so when we came home, we could either eat, or reheat it a bit and then eat.

Conclusion

Although it was only for two weeks I gained lot of useful experience in marketing via social media and also in the communication in English. I would definitely recommend this project and I hope that I will visit London again soon.

Maybe it is because of our delicious food in the Czech Republic, but we did not like it at all. She told us to let her know if we want to have a dinner the next

day, but we were at home every day around 9 pm, so we bought something to eat in the city. The last day, Joan made for us English breakfast. It was delicious. Her house was adorable, I loved how designed everything was and it was so clean! Perfect!

Free time

Markéta Frömelová, 3.VK – Further Education College, Information Services and Librarianship

Work

I was working with Lukas in Kilburn Library, which is a middle sized public library and they operate under Brent Libraries group. It is the oldest library in group. They have open access only on ground floor with fiction and nonfiction books for both adults and children. There is a section even for the youngest children with a few toys and books for them. They provide loans and references books, newspapers, audio books and DVDs. They also provide access to computer, free Wi-Fi access, photocopier, printer and scanner and 40 study spaces. Beside that they organise two times a week singing for small

children with parents. They are focused more on their community then we are used to in the Czech Republic. Our main tasks during internship were revision of

collections, preparing reservations and helping readers with their requests and needs. We also stocked returned books and worked with the library system. It is working little bit different then we are used from our libraries. They have also a little bit different attitude to readers. They try to teach them to be independent as much as it is possible.

Readers have two self-check machines for borrowing and returning. They have access to Online Public Accessible Catalogue (OPAC) and they are encouraged to use it. What was really interesting for me was the opportunity to speak with people from different cultural

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background. Everyone was so nice to us that it helped me to gain some confidence with communication in English.

They helped us with everything and try to show what they could. Our working hours were from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Accommodation

I stayed in Harrow with two other girls, Adéla and Jana. Our host was Annete and she was really nice to us. Jana and I were in one smaller room and Adele was in the second even smaller room. In the night it was quite cold but that was understandable because we were there before Christmas and British haven't got as warm houses as we have. We had a key so we could stay in the centre after work, but we usually came back for dinner and some chill. Annete had very nice Christmas decorations and although she was a good cook we had also some convenience food. She



chose and take what we wanted. I

usually ate some toast with butter and ham or cheese or jam and coffee. After breakfast I left for work because I travelled nearly an hour to get there. I used mostly underground but I travelled also by a double-decker. Annete has a cat called Missie. She wasn't into cuddling much but she was so cute. Annete's house was nice and modern. She is a hairdresser and she works from home. She showed us some photos of her children and from vacations. We enjoyed our time there.

What I really enjoyed was Christmas mood everywhere. Decorations and lights look magical in the night time. In the weekend, our teacher prepared programme for us. Eva Gottwaldová, 3.A – Business Academy

Work

I was working in company called Ultra Estates. It is a real estate agency, which is specialized in sale and rental of flats or houses in some specific areas of London. It is a smaller company,

at the time of my internship there were 3 employees.

Their office is located in the centre of London, so my journey to work took about 40 minutes, but I had a direct line close to my house and that was an advantage. At the same time it was located near all the apartments and houses which the real estate agency offered to rent or buy, but it was also very small. Basically, it was an open office where three tables were located side by side - one for me and two for my other colleagues and side located was the table for my boss.

As for the work itself, my main tasks included easier things such as working with e-mail, assigning enquiries for flats into the business program, choosing suitable furniture for their apartments for



rent, contacting clients and collecting messages for my colleagues. My main work was making an overview of the various two bedroom and one bedroom apartments in various London areas, newly added by competitions for rent, along with basic information about them, such as the rental price per week, more detailed information as a special equipment, whether it includes concierge services, etc., if it's furnished or un-furnished and if they prefer long-term or short-term rentals. This task was very interesting for me because I've learned about the rental prices in London, which are really very high in comparison to the Czech rental.

The first week of the internship my boss was present, but the second week he had to go away and I only stayed with my two colleagues. My work hours were from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm, and I had a lunch break between 13:00 and 15:00 for one hour. The first week I was at work until 18:00, but as the second week the boss left, my other supervisor let me out of work earlier. The boss was very kind, he had a great accent, and when he did not have a meeting, which was not so often, he tried to chat with me. My other two colleagues were great and helpful. I enjoyed staying with them for those 2 weeks. They even offered me a full-time job but I obviously refused, because of studying, but they still convinced me that if I wanted to work there after graduation, they would love to welcome me there.



Accommodation

I lived with Nikola Svobodová in London area called Queensbury. The underground station was a 20-minute walk from our house; there we could find the Jubilee line, which took us

directly to the centre. Two of our friends lived just a short walk from our "home for 2 weeks" - for about 5 minutes. The funny fact is that they lived at our hostess's sister's house. The house was very clean and nice. We lived with Mrs. Carol, who was very funny, nice and attentive, and although we did not spend that much time in the house, she always talked to us a bit each day. We had provided breakfast and dinner at our host family and for lunch we got money. We made our own breakfast – she allowed us to use everything from the refrigerator and she made us always warm dinner, which was great. She cooked such a good chicken and she even cooked for us great shrimps one evening. The last day of our stay there she made us a full English breakfast, which was such a delicious ending of our trip. The complete stay at her place was very pleasant for us and we could not wish for a better family.



Free time



I had free time every day after work. I always spent it with my friends. Every day we went somewhere - for example shopping, eating, or just visiting some interesting places and London as such. We often visited Primark, which is probably visited by every student visiting London. We also visited the typical London "fast food" Five Guys, which is not quite the fast food we are used to in the Czech Republic, not comparable to McDonalds. We had a great opportunity to get to know a lot of London places we previously knew mainly from social networks. On Thursday, the second week, before we got the certificates, we all together visited Sky Garden, where we had a magnificent view of London. At the weekend, together with Professor Lojdova and Koudelkova, we visited the main monuments such as the Parliament, the National Gallery, which is located at Trafalgar Square, the Madame Tussaud's - a museum

Work

I worked at a company called Influential English which is located in Marylebone. Influential English is a language school that provides English courses for student from all around the world. They have variety of courses from general English to IELTS Academic courses; they even offer live online courses.

Before we got to London I was quite scared that I would get lost in London underground on my way to work or when we would go to the city, but it was much easier than I thought. On our first day country manager Adriana from the ADC collage explained to us how to use public transport and that was extremely useful. She showed us application that's similar to IDOS, it's called City mapper where we could find the best connection to get where we needed to. We lived in Rayners



Lane so on my way to work I used Metropolitan line and then changed for Bakerloo line on Baker Street. It took about half an hour to get to work.


My working hours were supposed to be from 9:30am to 5:30pm but my supervisor changed it so I usually started from 11:30am. That was awesome because I could at least sleep in. During my work experience at Influential English I only met 3 teachers and one of them was my supervisor Craig. In the beginning I was little bit scared that I wouldn't understand my supervisor and my other colleagues but their English was really very nice so I could understand everything they said.

I had a desk right in the study room where they had classes so I could also listen to the lesson and new accents of the students while working on my tasks - that was a plus. In general I liked my experience at Influential English because of the friendly atmosphere there.

Free time

We had a weekend programme with our teachers and although it was rather cold outside, we really enjoyed it. Work

I spent my London work experience in Library at Willesden Green with Adéla Málková. This library is included to the Brent Libraries which is web of libraries in Brent - London borough in north west London. My classmate Markéta Frömelová and Adéla's classmate Lukáš Tölg worked in other Brent library – Kilburn Library. The Library at Willesden Green is simultaneously a Brent's community centre because it has a gallery, an archive and the museum of Brent's history.

It is a large size public library with 3 floors plus 1 floor for staff. Library organises regular cultural and educational like events Chatterbooks Reading and Crafts Club, IT for Beginners, Scrabble Group...

Our job description was routine library work plus assistance during children programme. They have programme for children nearly every day. We attended regular Bookstart Story



and Rhyme Time for Under 5s. And because it was Christmas time, Santa visited our library of course. Another day children saw Charles Dicken's Christmas carol which was played by some really good-acting volunteers. They had also really amazing props and costumes, in my opinion even

historically accurate.

There are workers of many nationalities, for example Armenian, Indian, so I came into contact with more language accents. All colleagues were very friendly and open (not only colleagues at the library, but people in London in general); they offered their help and advice many times. We became good friends with few of colleagues, especially with Georgetta from Armenia. Therefore our last day at the library was full of sad and warm hugging.



I was really positively shocked by knowing the fact their lunch break is one hour long and they have even tea break in the afternoon for 30 minutes. In library there is café where one can go for lunch, but there are more bistros only a few meters from the building of library, so it was absolutely no rush at all as I was used to in the Czech Republic during lunch breaks. Short break with tea with milk and cookies is a really enjoyable habit. We spent our tea breaks in staff area where is a large, open space with kitchen equipment like fridges, microwaves... They have even two fridges and two microwaves for vegan and non-vegan food. Sometimes we spent there our lunch breaks too.

Accommodation

We lived in a nice small house in Harrow, which is a typical lovely London suburb. Our



landlady Annette was a hairdresser born with an Irish background, who works from home and she has a black cat named Missie. I shared a bedroom with my classmate Markéta and Adéla slept in a next bedroom. For breakfast we had lots of food to choose, for example several kinds of cereals or several kinds of spread for toasts. In England, people are not used to have home-cooked meals as in the Czech Republic, but we were lucky, because Anette cooked very well. She even tried cooking goulash.

Transport

Even if transport across London took more time than in Brno, I really enjoyed traveling to work and back. We got Oyster cards so we could travel in London without problems with buying tickets. From our house, it was only a four-minute-walk to a bus stop. There was also the ADC College only ten minutes. Traveling by bus was ok, but buses did not have stable timetable as in Brno, sometimes we were waiting for bus for about 20 minutes and sometimes two buses arrived in five minutes. But that depended on weather too. I went to work with by a double decker and then by tube, it took about 30 minutes. When we decided to go to city centre, we went by tube or train. Transport was very easy especially because of amazing phone applications designated for transport in London. You don't have to even know the name of bus stop, just type place where you want to be and these apps nearly took your hand and guided you.


Eliška Musilová, 3. P, Further Education College, Law and Economics – Legal Studies


Julie Procházková, 3.D – Business Academy

Conclusion



Next to kitchen there was a dining room and living room. On the middle floor there were three bedrooms: one for Ester, one for the oldest girl and the third for two small girls. There was also their bathroom too. They had a small garden in the backyard. The family had a car. The house was placed next to a big shop Tesco and next to it there was the underground so that was great for

us. It didn't take us long to get to work or to the town. There were many shops all around this area. I was surprised that there were many SO different nationalities. The food in our family wasn't very good. British people aren't probably good cooks. We had dinner every day at 7 p. m. First day we had some Asian cooked meat with potatoes.
