

LONDON WORK EXPERIENCE 2019/20

This project "Studying without borders VI" enabled the work experience of 38 students of the Business School, Secondary Special School for Librarians and Further Education College Brno to Great Britain and Ireland for two weeks (10 working days).



The winter term of this project was attended by 19 students: Veronika Zemanová (3. A), Anita Eclerová (3. A), Natálie Mazánková (3. A), Denisa Placarová (3. A), Adéla Kulichová (3. A), Barbora Doupovcová (3. A), Gabriela Kilianová (3. B), Adéla Mlčochová (3. B), Sára Vašíčková (3. B), Martina Horalíková (3. C), Jovana Blažková (3. C), Lucie Vyšatová (3. C), Lucie Janíčková (3. D), Terezie Žáková (3. AV), Andrea Smejkalová (3. BV), Michaela Rusmanová (3. BV), Kristýna Smolová (3. P), Martin Rozčínský (3. Q), Matěj Toman (3. Q).

We received the grant from the European Union project Erasmus+ and 19 students + 2 teachers could travel to London in December. There is another group that will go in April. We are the ninth group that was given this chance to live and work in the United Kingdom for two weeks. Everything was financed by the European Union. All we needed was pocket money.

During the time we worked in various London companies: The College of Haringey, Blue Ocean Homes, Let's Talk Property, JP Accountancy, Eleada Care Services, etc.

We became part of a team and were supervised at all times by at least one mentor. We participated in everyday procedures and developed new specialised skills in the field of our study. The managers prepared daily work tasks and monitored our progress together with our accompanying teachers. The managers evaluated our achievements at the end of the working experience.

Most of us worked in different companies. Those of us who are students of business school worked with business correspondence and with databases of clients, prepared presentations,



dealt with internet enquiries, answered phones, took messages, served and advised customers and supported senior staff. We did some market research, assisted in various computerized activities such as processing, data input, emailing. We worked with internal IT system, PCs, printers, scanners and other office equipment. We also had some general duties such as filling, faxing and photocopying. We assisted and communicated with customers on daily basis and thus improved their communication skills.

The typical tasks of students of information services and librarianship were answering reference inquiries, lending documents to the user via automatic library systems, creating catalogue records of documents and books, modifying records in the database of books, looking up relevant records and communication with clients.

Students of social services dealt with documents, clients and prepared their case history. Other tasks were preparing an analysis on the specifics of the particular minority according to the type of the organization, offer of services and intervention.

After working hours we had free time which we spent together or went sightseeing. We lived in host families which provided us with food and place to stay. Every once in a while we all met in the ADC College, which is the partner of our school in Erasmus+. If we had any problem we could consult it with our teachers or an ADC College employee.

It was great experience for all of us because we learned new skills and improved our English. At the end of the two weeks work placement project a ceremony was held at ADC College to celebrate our achievements – we received the certificates of completing our work placement.

We also received references from our employers and Europass Mobility. Some of us were offered a part-time job for summer.

Our programme

On the first day when we came to London (Sunday) we were given Oyster cards and met our host families with whom we spend the evening to get to know them. On Monday we all met in ADC College and they told us details about travelling in London. After the meeting we had to find our way to our companies and take a selfie which we had to show in ADC College. Then we started working.

At the weekend we all went sightseeing. We visited e. g. Parliament, London Eye, Madame Tussaud's. From Monday to Friday we were working. In the end we met at the ADC College where each of us received Europass Mobility. In the evening our group visited Sky Garden with beautiful views of the city. On Saturday we said goodbye to our host families and travelled back to Brno.



We managed work in companies without problems and our employers appraised our communication skills, professional skills and work attitude. We improved our skills in contact with customers, administrative work and use of information technologies. We also learned to present their work to our colleagues or customers in a suitable way, which contributed to the development of our soft-skills. We broadened our professional English terminology. All these aspects will enable us to gain competitive advantage at the labour market. New experience from London companies will be used during our further education and practice.

Work experience abroad is nothing to worry about. If you doubt it read about our experience in this brochure. It can be your turn next year!

Work

I worked at Blue Ocean Homes, which is an estate agents company providing lettings, rents and customer services. The company is located in Harrow, so it took only 15 minutes to get there including bus ride and walking.

It is a smaller company with 5 employees. My supervisor, Mihaela Dodi, was from Romania, and she was always willing to help me. All of them very nice, talkative and created a friendly atmosphere. I really enjoyed my time there. My working hours were from 9am to 5 pm.

Accommodation

Accommodation

In host family I stayed with my two classmates Adéla and Denisa in a big flat for two weeks. When we arrived to London, host families came for us and took us home and after that we had warm dinner. We lived in Eastcote lane in Northolt. We shared one big room with three beds and we had so much fun together. Our host mother Apri is originally from Armenia, but she was born in Iran. She lived in many countries like Cyprus, Germany,.. Now she lives in England in Northolt. She works with children with special needs from birth to 5 years of age. She lives on her own and she has one adult daughter who has grown up and left the home. Apri likes to do some creative work, like making dresses and baking. She was nice and helpful but sometimes we disagreed on something. We didn't talk very often, we were all tired after work and because we often spent time after work in the centre of London.

Her flat was really clean and meals were tasty and healthy. For breakfast we usually had several kinds of cereals with milk, fruit, toasts with my favourite peanut butter or nutela. We had the same breakfast every day, so we bought our own breakfast sometimes. We had money to buy lunch on our own so I usually went to nearest Tesco and I bought lunch there. For dinners we had meals such as pasta, pizza, salads, china with rice or baked potatoes with vegetable. She prepared warm dinners for us every day. If we wanted to stay a little bit longer in the centre of London, we just sent her a message to let her know and she didn't mind. So it was not problem to come home later. It was quite cold in



the house especially at night. Heating did not heat too much.

We walked to the nearest train station every day because the buses were late so it was faster to walk. The way from our house to city centre took about 40 minutes. The flat where we stayed was quite big, bigger than we expected. There was a kitchen where we could use microwave, toaster and fridge, living room, bathroom. They preferred us to have a shower in the evening because our host mother used it in the morning.

Work

I spent my work experience in the company called Whitefield School. This school is located in the London Borough of Barnet. It is a secondary school with six forms. There are pupils and students of all nationalities and religions. It was originally a Secondary Modern School and opened in autumn 1954. In 2009 it came under new leadership and was in the top 1% most improved schools in the country in 2010. They invested over £3 million in the site renovation. They have a range of modern facilities like drama studio, fitness, sport pitches, the acorn theatre, and a music studio for students but people can also hire these facilities.

My working hours were from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The way to work lasted more than hour. I used train and double-decker but the bus was often late and then stood in traffic jam. First day I was so nervous about work but I was working with Excel and Word so it was not that difficult and my supervisor Ewa Micun helped me with everything I needed. She was so kind and helpful. Ewa is from Poland and she teaches Psychology at Whitefield School. My colleagues were so amazing; everyone was so nice, friendly and always smiling.

My main tasks were working with MS Word, Excel, PowerPoint, writing emails, helping with research, working with databases, correspondence. I was also categorizing data and doing Christmas decoration. I was working on computer in office most of the time.

I had an opportunity to go to English and psychology lessons with other students. It was a really good experience and I really enjoyed the lessons. I met some pupils and I could talk with them. Ewa also took me to the Christmas party at school and I helped her with selling cupcakes to students for charity.

Free time

Every day right after work, we went to the centre of London with other classmates. We visited really nice places such as Covent Garden, Oxford Street, Leicester Square,



Winter Wonderland and Christmas markets. I really enjoyed the Christmas decoration in the streets; it was so beautiful especially in Oxford Street. I also enjoyed shopping Christmas presents for my family and friends.

At the weekend we had program together with our teachers and other students from our group. On Saturday morning we met near Big Ben. First we visited Parliament, Westminster Abbey. Then we were walking toward Trafalgar Square. We also visited China Town, Piccadilly Circus, famous for big televisions with advertisements and last we visited Madame Tussaud's museum which I really liked but it was my third time in the museum. On Sunday we had meeting point at Trafalgar Square. We went to the Buckingham Palace and we saw the changing of the guards, St. James's Park, St. Paul's, the Tower of London and then we took a ride on the London Eye. We had an amazing view of night London. Next Friday we went to see Sky Garden. It was at night and the view was amazing.

Conclusion

This internship was really great experience to me and I am really happy for that. I am very grateful for this opportunity. I would definitely recommend this programme to all students and I would definitely go again.

Work

I worked in FOCUS English School London. This school is mostly for foreigners to learn English. They offer affordable English courses for beginners, intermediate and advanced learners. Their high quality English classes focus on real life situations for students to be able to use English from day one - such as work, travel, study or for talking with friends and relatives.

I was there with Veronika Zemanová, but we did different tasks. In the first week I was working in a small classroom with my mentor Adrian and he taught me how to do quizzes for their students. Then I did some presentations and tutorials how to make the quizzes for Veronika for the second week. The next week I and Veronika switched and I worked in the room which was served as the reception. My mentor for this week was Mayara, because our supervisor Alexandre is a teacher in this school and he had to teach students. My main task was to create a new video, something like a promo for the school and then I was posting this video with some text on Facebook pages. Then I was programming new app with irregular verbs and doing other quizzes for students.



This school was very small, apart from me and Veronika there were only four other employees and about 10 students. Even the place was very small, but now they are already moved to another nicer and bigger place.

Our working hours were from Monday to Thursday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. with an hour break for lunch, but we could take only a half our break for lunch and then left at 4.30. On Fridays we worked only to 2.30 p. m. - I was really glad about it, because we could go shopping or go to the centre of London and we had lots of time till the evening. When we finished at 5 p.m., outside was dark and I was tired and went straight home.

Luckily my way home was not long. It was less than 10 minutes from work to the underground station, then I went for about 20 minutes by the underground or overground and then I walked for 15 minutes home.

I am very glad and thankful for the opportunity work in this company. Everyone was very nice to me and I think I learned a lot.

Accommodation

I lived in Woodcock Hill with two other girls from our group at Ms Dawn's. She was very nice. We shared one room - there were three beds, one bigger wardrobe and two other smaller cabinets. We even had a TV but we never used it.

Because we were there before Christmas, it was really cold there. I slept in sweatpants and sweatshirt and even had two blankets, but still I was sometimes waking up and shaking because of the cold.



In the whole house there was not just us, Ms Dawn had two sons who lived there, and three other students also from Czech Republic. We unfortunately did not have dinner together, so we didn't have many chances to even know Dawn, but we at least met these Czech students who were there for three months.

I did not like most of the meals, because I am used to eat something different, but I really appreciate that Dawn was doing vegetarian version for me, because I am a vegetarian. And it was also very nice from her that if we wanted be longer in the town or come home later; she kept our dinner for us in the fridge.

We had to prepare breakfast by ourselves because Dawn was working from 6.30 a.m. and we were getting up around 7 a.m. or later. We had some bread and jam in the fridge that we could eat, but after few days we bought hummus and some fruit and vegetable, because eating bread with jam every day is just not that tasty.

Free time



The first day I went with my colleague Veronica and her classmate and roommate Barbora to our work and then we went to Burger King and I was pretty surprised that there are vegetarian meals even in fast foods. We bought some souvenirs and then we went shopping.

When we finished at work earlier we went also shopping or we went e.g. to the Hyde Park which was really nice, because we could get almost anywhere by underground

easily and quickly.

At the weekend we went to the centre of London and we visited some interesting monuments. I really liked the China town and a really beautiful view of the town from Sky Garden.

Work



I spent my work experience with Natalie in a company called JP Accountancy which is located in Harrow. This company was established in 2010 and it focuses on accounting and tax consultancy, accounts preparation, business advice, bookkeeping services, financial planning and advice. The clients are sole traders, medium sized companies, franchises and start-ups. Our main task was working in QuickBooks, which is accounting software. Our work started at 9:30 a. m.

and ended at 5 p. m. My supervisor's name was Keith, he was really kind, funny, always in a good mood and he was helping us all those days when we were doing our tasks. This company was close to my host family's house. It was just 35 minutes far away – 25 minutes by bus and 10 minutes walk. Last day they gave us gifts. It was very nice.

Accommodation

I lived in a family with other three girls from my school. We lived in a small house with an older married couple in retirement and with one of their sons, Mr. S. We stayed in two rooms and we had our own bathroom. For breakfast we usually had cereals with milk or toast with marmalade or ham and cheese. We bought lunches ourselves from pocket money. Dinner was always warm and very, very delicious – e.g. pizza, lasagne, pasta, burger, chicken with rice and so on.

Work

I worked in Outreach and Home library's central at Willesden, which is main central library for other Brent libraries in London where all the books are in stock. This library is preparing programmes for children and people in need for free. But it works like normal library.

There are about 50 workers mainly from India, Africa, Italy and just one from England and about 60 volunteers in Willesden library.

My supervisors were Kanta and Nala from India and they are bosses in Willesden library. At the beginning of my internship I worked with other 4 students from Czech Republic. They were there for one week with me so I met new friends and we are still in contact, they told me

what I needed to know about work in library. So it was easier for me to understand all things. They gave me some advices to facilitate the work. I made orders for hospitals and schools, worked with the library system, found books in the library stock and dealt with clients.



Accommodation

The library is located in Willesden so my daily trip took about 30 minutes by bus to Stanmore station and from there by tube to the Willesden Green from Stanmore where I lived with Jovana and Lucka. We had a really nice house and rooms.

Our host family was amazing; they were super nice and patient. Jean (our host mother 😊) cooked every day best dishes ever. Her pasta was so delicious. Their house was always tidy and clean. There were two cats – Jip Jip and Dusty- we cuddled them every time we saw them. We had two rooms one for Lucka and one for me and Jovana. We had really good times together, every evening we just sat in our room and we were talking about everything.

Free time

I saw nice places in London. For example Chinatown was super cool, we bought many and many sweets and drinks which we can't buy here. The Harrow School was breathtaking, I was

there with Ms Lojdová and because it was sunny we could just walk around and saw many animals there.



Shopping was also our speciality; we spent a lot of money in shopping malls, for example in Primark. Every time we went there, we bought something different and our purses were lighter and lighter 😊 TK Max was another shop where we came with money and left without them, just with many bags with clothes, cosmetic products and food.

Conclusion

This internship gave me a lot – new friends, new experiences, I saw new places and new country. Work

I was working in English Studio Language School. They offer a range of courses (general English, exam preparation and business English) for different learning needs. You can choose from English courses in the morning, at midday and in the afternoon, with classes for all English levels from beginners to advanced. The courses are based on practical English that you can use every day. Conversation and speaking are the main focus with lots of grammar and writing practice.

First day I met my supervisor Will and he welcomed me to their school, explained what my work would be about and also introduced me to other colleagues. They were all really nice to me and always offered help when I needed it. My working hours were from 8:30-12:00 a.m., then I had free hour to go out for lunch. After that I worked from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

I was really pleasantly surprised with my working schedule. I had an amazing opportunity to attend morning English courses with other students. I went to advanced English class with about 9 other students. It depended, because new students were leaving and coming as their course dates differed.

English Studio Language School is located in High Holborn, 113 in the central London. I travelled there every day by underground for about 35 to 40 minutes, which was fine.

Accommodation

I was staying with two other girls - Denisa and Anita. We lived in Harrow, about 15 minutes by foot from the underground station. Our host's name was Arpi. She was living alone since her daughter had graduated from the college. Arpi lived in flat. She had really clean rooms and she prepared dinner every evening. For breakfast we could have either some fruit or cereals with milk or yoghurt or maybe eggs.

First day she showed us how to get to the underground and also where we can go for shopping near the house. There were many supermarkets like Tesco or Lidl and also some other shops which was cool. Then she showed us our room where we slept. There were beds and a closet and a big window so there was enough space for the three of us. The only unpractical thing was little time for shower because we were three girls there so sometimes it was difficult to be ready before it was late at night. Work

I worked in a company called JP Accountancy. My main task was basically to work in an accounting program called Quickbooks. I worked with that program most of the time but sometimes they gave me different work to do, for example archiving bills to specific customers and then adding them to their account on Quickbook, sorting bills, etc.

The place I worked in was separated into three offices. One was used to keep the archived documents so I am not sure if I can count it as the office but they had a computer there so let's count it.






Michaela Rusmanová, 3. SP – Further Education College - Social Services



Work

After our meeting we got a mission to find the way to our new job and take a picture in front of the building and when we were done our journey truly began.





friendly. The only problem was that everyone from the company was from a different country and has their accent so sometimes it was difficult to understand them.

Accommodation

I was staying with my classmate Barbora in Harrow in one really friendly family with Irish origins. They had 2 kids, a boy who had already finished university and was looking for a job and the girl who was 16 years old so she was our age. The house had 3 floors and we stayed on the middle floor. We stayed in one nice and cosy room. There was also a bathroom on the floor.

We didn't have any problems with our family. They were really kind to us for example the boy was playing cards with us almost every day. The food was nice too. We had money to buy lunch on our own and the dinner was prepared by our family. She cooked meals such as spaghetti or fried chicken with potatoes or rice. Work



I worked in the Birchwood care home near to Harrow on the Hill. It is the care home with nursing for elderly people from different ethnic communities across North London. It's privately owned, registered for a maximum of 150 clients (there're 150 single rooms with TV). Registered care categories are dementia, old age, younger adults. Specialist care categories are e. g. Alzheimer's disease, cancer care, challenging behaviour, epilepsy, hearing impairment, multiple sclerosis, etc. The care home offers palliative care, respite care and convalescent care. There's also a separate specialist dementia care unit. Clients can have their own furniture if they wish so. Gardens are accessible for residents (with wheelchair access).

My way to the work was by foot. I lived close – 20 minutes far from this organization. This care home was amazing. The attitude of all employees was very kind and individual. Every client is different and employees respect it. There were three supervisors, I was working with all of them. The social work in Great Britain is quite different from the Czech Republic. The social workers focus on doing shows and fun. For example we prepared Christmas parties, we went to school and kids did a show for the seniors. It was an amazing experience. I learned a lot. I improved my English skills. Many Czech social workers should also be so kind to clients and make the care home a beautiful place just like a home for elderly people!



Accommodation

I lived with two students of secondary school Kotlarska - with Lucka and Martina. We lived in a huge house close to the tube station Northwick Park. Our host family consisted of three people - the mother and two sons. The sons actually did not talk with us a lot, but the communication with our host mother was very good. I could not get used to pre-packed food there. I really prefer fresh food and Czech meals. The dinners were quite late about 9 or 10 p. m. I know that was because they work till the late hours. It was so cold inside the house, I was freezing every day there – but it's the same everywhere in Britain. The host family accepted us and they were kind to us. We all still in touch.

Transport

I was mostly using the underground. I was lucky because I lived close to my work. So I didn't have to use any transport to work. After work I usually went to the city. I was shocked first time I saw the map of London's underground. It seemed so difficult to understand this system. But after the first meeting with our lector I understood quite quickly. I also used buses, enjoyed double-deckers and trains.

Free time

I spent my free time with my roommates or with the girls from my class in the centre of London. We were buying presents and stuff like this. We were going out, because we wanted to learn how to find our way round in a big city. One day we were in Winter Wonderland, it was something like our Christmas markets but also with some attractions. And another day we were in Hyde Park. Then we took LDR train. It is a train without the driver and you can see the whole city. I bought all the Christmas presents for my family too. I went shopping many times - there are so many shops there. Shopping is much cheaper than in the Czech Republic.

The first weekend we spent with other students together. During our trip we saw many interesting sights. Mrs Koudelkova told us interesting information about each sight we had seen. We saw for example the Parliament, Trafalgar Square, Westminster Abbey, the Big Ben (but it was under scaffolding), the museum of Madame Tussaud's where we could take amazing pictures with the celebrities, singers from England even from the USA, the presidents of USA, the Queen and the Royal family... the London Eye where we were inside of one huge cabin and saw the London from bird's eye view, the Tower of London where we could learn the history of the castle and London, the London Bridge, the Buckingham Palace and many others....The second Friday after the last meeting in ADC we went to the Sky Garden at the top of a tall building (37 floors above London). It was at night and the view of the city was beautiful and amazing.

Conclusion

I am really glad for this experience. I worked in the care home in London also in the Czech Republic so now I can compare the main differences between them. I also improved my English skills. I met a great host family and I made new friendship with other students. What an experience! And we were there in the most beautiful time in the year. The Christmas in London is amazing.
